Facility Notes

The entrance to the Historic Records Center is located in the rear of the building, at the intersection of Main Street and West Street in Fairfax City. You have to go through security when entering the building, but can bring in laptops, portable scanners, cell phones and cameras. You can also make copies of documents for \$.50 per page.

Our Holdings

The Historic Records Center holds records dating back to the formation of Fairfax County in 1742 up through the early 1900s. Our earliest court records include information from what are now Arlington, Alexandria and Loudoun counties in Virginia. As a court archive, we hold the Land Records, Probate Records, Vital Records, Tax Records and Court Case files among other smaller record groups.
